

Requirements for completion

Department of Histology and Embryology

Subject: Histology and Embryology 2

Year of study, Term: 2.y., WT

Study programme: General Medicine

1. For successful completion of the practical exercises is required:

a) Student has to attend **all practical lessons** (100%).

b) In case of excused **absence on practical lessons (maximally 3)**, student has to study missing slides and draw them to the practical textbook individually (selfstudy) and is obliged to respect and follow the instructions of his/her teacher.

c) During semester, student has to participate in **3 compulsory control written tests** from strictly determined topics and gain the **total average of results minimally 60 % from all three compulsory tests**. If the student passes compulsory control tests successfully (average from all three tests minimally 60%), the student is allowed to continue to the semestral slide test. The student is entitled for **one retake term for each compulsory control written test** in exact term. In the case of writing retake control test, the last test (not the best written one) is counted to total average.

1. compulsory control test: Skin + mammary gland + Cardiovascular system + Lymphatic system (regular term in the **5.W** on practical lesson; retake term in 6.W – exact date and time is determined by the teacher)

2. compulsory control test: Digestive system 1,2,3 + Respiratory system (regular term in the **9.W** on practical lesson; retake term in 10.W – exact date and time is determined by the teacher)

3. compulsory control test: Urinary system + Male and Female reproductive system (regular term in the **12.W** on practical lesson; retake term in 13.W – exact date and time is determined by the teacher)

Each test is composed of 20 different questions (abcd questions - ONLY one correct answer; open questions; pictures: schematic drawings/microphotographs/own drawings based on the lectures and practical lessons).

If the student **does not gain the average minimally 60% from all three compulsory control tests**, student is evaluated **FX – failed** (Study Rules of Procedure P.J. Šafárik University, the Faculty of Medicine, part II., article 13: 1c and 6.).

d) In case of failure to attain these limits (point c), semestral slide test and final exam is not permitted and the student is graded Fx (failed) at the end of semester (Study Rules of Procedure P.J. Šafárik University, the Faculty of Medicine, part II., article 13: 1c and 6.)

e) Student has to pass **Semestral slide test performed in the 14th week on the practical lesson**, which consists of recognition and description of **2 histological**

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slides from the winter semester. For successful completion, student has to gain **minimally 60% from each slide**.

f) Student is entitled for **two retake terms for the Semestral slide test** during the first, second or third week of the examination period (exact date and time is determined by the teacher).

g) The limits for the registration for the final exam are:

Attendance on practical lessons - 100% (max. 3 excused absences)

Compulsory control written tests - average from all tests minimally 60%

Semestral slide test - minimally 60%

h) **Attention:** If the student does not participate on the the regular term of compulsory control written tests and/or semestral slide test for any reason (personal, family, health), student will not have an alternative date, but will take the exam on the retake term. If the student does not take part in retake term for any reason, student is not entitled to have a replacement date.

* **Special award for students with excellent results:** If the student gains the average from compulsory control written tests and semestral slide test (in regular term) **91% and more** (excellent results), **the student** is allowed to **continue directly to the oral part of final exam** (the student does not participate in the final written test).

2. For successful acquirement of the credits from subject is necessary to pass:

Final exam that consists of 2 parts:

A. Final written test

The student must gain **minimally 60%** from the test, to continue to the final oral exam.

(*special award for students with excellent results)

B. Final oral exam - three questions:

a) histologic technics, cytology and tissues

b) microscopic anatomy

c) embryology

Student must pass **each of three questions minimally for 60%** (E).

The total evaluation of the final exam (graded A-E) includes outcomes of the semestral slide test, final written test and final oral exam.
