## Requirements for admission to the final examination in Medical Biophysics for students of Dental Medicine in Academic year 2024/2025

The education of Medical biophysics takes a form of lectures and laboratory exercises. Non-participation in practical exercises shall be properly excused with the teacher. If there is a serious reason, the student may excuse the practical exercises within three weeks at most during the semester. The missed practical exercise shall be compensated by the written report on the missed topic in the range at least three pages of A4 size.

Assessment of the learning achievements in the study subject is performed by continuous monitoring during the teaching part of the period and by the examination for the period of study concerned. To ensure the adequate preparation for the exam it is given mandatory attendance at the lectures at least 60%. The student must master the lecture topics at the final exam in the content and form presented, even when he has not participated in the lecture.

For the students to be admitted to the final examination in Medical biophysics it is required:

- completed practical course in medical biophysics, i.e., attendance at all practical exercises, finished with accepted reports on the measurement
- the score at least 60% of the maximum number of points, the student can get during the semester

## A. ITEMS CONTRIBUTING TO CONTINUOUS MONITORING ON THE STUDY:

- a) small test at practical exercise
- b) attendance at practical lesson and accepted correct report on the measurement
- c) midterm test concerning lectured topics

The total sum of all above gives the maximum number of points (100%), which will be used as the base for the calculation of an individual score. There is a possibility to get some points during a lesson for the extraordinary individual activity.

The score less than 60% must be compensated by successful retake test at the end of the practical course.

## **B. FINAL EXAM EVALUTION:**

Final examination for the period of the study concerned takes place in a written form and represents 100% of the final evaluation of the subject. The knowledge evaluation is expressed by the percentage level from the received points. To complete the exam successfully it is necessary to gain at least 60% of points (assessment E).
