

REQUIREMENTS

FOR SLOVAK LANGUAGE COURSE 1, 2, 3, 4

ATTENDANCE:

Students are required to attend Slovak language classes according to the schedule. Attendance is mandatory.

Students are not allowed more than **four absences** during the semester for classes which meet two times a week (Slovak language 1, 2) and **two absences** for classes which meet once a week (Slovak language 3,4).

Please reserve these for when you are sick or have other serious reasons to be absent since you only have these options and no more! Once you have missed more, you will not be allowed to continue the course. You will not receive credits for the course.

Students are expected to be in class on time and to remain in class until the class ends. Any late arrival of more than 15 minutes will count as one hour's absence. Attendance is recorded by teachers on a class register for each session. Students are recorded as 'present', 'late' or 'absent'.

Students who use personal computers, or electronic devices for activities unrelated to the class being taught will be marked absent.

Mobile phones are not allowed in class.

Students are required to have **a textbook** in printed form and **an exercise book** to practise Slovak handwriting and to complete homework assignments.

ASSESSMENT:

Continuous assessment is based on the results of **two tests** during the semester (Weeks 06/07 and 12/13). A minimum final overall average of **65 percent** is required (Test1+Test2 : 2 = final result).

There are no retakes during the semester.

Students with a final overall average lower than 65 percent are given an opportunity to take another test in the last week of the semester (Week 14) to prove their knowledge of the Slovak language. The test result must be at least 65 percent.

Students with a final overall average lower than 65 percent in **the summer semester are not allowed to register** for the final oral exam, i.e. their final grade is FX.

Final assessment/grade in the summer semester is based on the results of written tests and oral examination.
