#### **CONFERENCE CALL FOR PAPERS**

This international and transdisciplinary conference is a follow up of two transdisciplinary meetings held in Strasbourg on the theme of anticipation, consecutivity and simultaneity. The first one, "Anticipation", was organized in 2000 and the second one, "Consecutivity and Simultaneity in Linguistics, Languages and Speech", in 2015. It is intended to bring together researchers from various disciplines of cognitive sciences, theory of translation and interpretation, linguistic sciences, including didactics of languages, robotics, biology, neurophysiology, psychology, psychomotricity, philosophy, history (this list not being exhaustive). It will explore various aspects of anticipation as a universal feature of perception-based mental activity making use of various anticipatory strategies enabling to recognize the correct sense trajectory/responsive reaction.

Consecutivity and simultaneity in cognition/phenomenology as a task-based process Anticipatory phenomena, such as protention, co-production, synchronisation, anaphora and cataphora, etc. Production-based versus process-based approaches to anticipation Multi-level redundancy (co-occurrence of anticipation prompts) and probability of anticipation of the correct sense trajectory Anticipation in interpretation (simultaneous and consecutive) Anticipation in translation Anticipation in language didactics
